As many of you know there has been a lot of transition in my life since returning from working in Swaziland nearly two years ago. What I saw in Swaziland opened my eyes to the injustices of the world in a new way and shifted my profoundly. worldview Even after returning to North America my heart ached for the children I had met whose daily lives consist of hunger, abandonment, disease, and abuse. Coupled with my own experiences I could not get out of my mind the stories I heard from friends working around the globe about children who are forced to work as child soldiers, prostitutes, and slaves; of kids who travel three hours to

and from school and die of preventable diseases like diarrhea and malaria; stories of young people without childhoods, or hope, who live and die nameless to the world. Stories that are so desperate it has caused me to wonder at times "can things truly change?"

Despite how desperate things appear there is an unwavering conviction in my heart that the answer is yes, things can change. My hope is rooted in the sure knowledge that God is at work in His world and His love is so much greater than ours could ever be. I know He desires to see His Kingdom come more fully and he is calling us to participate in its coming. I know that Jesus weeps for the broken, but he also offers us hope he offers us the chance to participate with him and bring shalom into His world, to His creation, to His people. Margaret Mead once said, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful committed citizens can change the world. Indeed it is the only thing that ever has." Jesus showed us this was true when he came and changed the world forever, but he also commanded us to do the same, and so it is time we invested in things to change the world - because the world needs change. The world needs change makers!

When I left Swaziland I had no idea what the future would hold, I only knew I wanted to be a change maker. I sensed that although God still had a plan for my life that involved serving the developing world, he wanted to teach me something new in the next season about need here in North America. With this in mind, I began working as the part time Youth Pastor here at St Mark's Ocean Park. My year at the church was a huge blessing and an incredible learning experience. Perhaps the most significant lessons I have learnt during this time is that God has given me a real passion for mentoring, developing, and equipping young people here in Canada where so many of them struggle to find meaning, purpose, and direction for their lives.

During that time I continued to pray about where God would direct me in the future; and how I could combine my passion for mentoring young people in Canada,

helping them find meaning in their life and relationship with God, igniting a passion in them to help create global change, along with my burning heart to fight injustice both local and globally while making the gospel of Jesus known. In light of this I cannot begin to tell you how excited I was to share with you in May this year, that God answered my prayers and provided me with an amazing opportunity that is allowing me to use all my passions to bring about change through an incredible organization called Loveworks.

Headquartered in Edmonton, Canada, Loveworks is seeking to engage young people in the fight against extreme global poverty by teaching them about the injustices taking place in the world through the process of helping them discover how they can use their God given passions, gifts, and abilities in their own communities to make a global difference. Loveworks is seeking to build young leaders like Rachel. As a fourteen year old, Loveworks helped Rachel discover that by leveraging her talents she could make a difference. She put her gifts to work in a creative way that raised over \$37,000 for Loveworks to help free young girls from sexual violence in Bolivia. Through helping change the world Rachel found herself profoundly changed, and this is the strategy Loveworks is using to help impact the lives of both rich and poor. In the west, Loveworks is seeking to develop young leaders who have a profound sense of purpose as they learn about what it means to love others radically by following the example of Jesus and spending themselves on behalf of the poor.

Loveworks helps young people who don't know where to begin to make a difference while being coached into fulfilling their dreams to help others and Jesus' hands become and feet. Loveworks is coming alongside many likeminded young people across Canada, and is partnering with likeminded organizations around the world to help create holistic sustainable global change through protecting orphans, fighting HIV/Aids and ending violent oppression, as well as empowering people through education and economic development, while helping provide food security, clean water, and medical care to those in desperate poverty. Loveworks is helping to raise up a generation to bring justice to the least of these (Matthew 25:40).

In May 2012, I stepped into the position of Director of Strategic Development and Public Engagement for Loveworks. This job is allowing me to use my passions and gifts to share the love of Jesus in order to impact young people in Canada as well as impacting communities in desperate need in the developing world. As part of my job I had the opportunity this summer to take twenty young people from Canada to Busiga, a village in Burundi. Burundi is the poorest country in the world, and our team went to connect with some of the most neglected people on the face of our planet, the Batwa people. Although I was excited to see God move in incredible ways through this trip I could not possibly have anticipated how much He would do in the lives of the young people, the lives of the Batwa people, and in my own life. It was truly a humbling and awesome experience. Through our time in Busiga, the young people were radically transformed as their eyes were opened in a new way to the injustices of the world and their hearts broke for the suffering of their brothers and sisters. They discovered that the people they had been learning about and on whose behalf they were doing projects were people just like themselves, who had hopes and dreams, laughed and cried, and who longed to be loved. On the other hand the Batwa people who call themselves forgotten ones," discovered that the world has not forgotten them, that we have seen the injustices they fight, we love them because God created them, he loves them, and they will not have to fight their battles alone; the Batwa people found a new dignity and hope that they can see change in their lifetime. Finally, and perhaps most incredibly, was that through the relationship built between this group from Canada and the Batwa, the Christians from the tribes that had traditionally oppressed the Batwa began to take notice that God was calling them to help these desperate people in their own backyard. One pastor in particular who had come from a neighboring tribe and community to watch us work alongside the Batwa, broke down in tears at the end of our time there and expressed, "I'm ashamed and my heart is broken. God had to bring you with great expense and inconvenience from across the world to do the work that he has called us to do but we have neglected in our own backyard." It was incredible to see neighbors from other tribes who had never spoken to or related to a Batwa person before in their lives, begin to join alongside them as we shared God's heart for the community in order to help build them a better future. It was truly a beautiful trip, and God did countless amazing things.



After this last trip, more than ever, I have no doubt that Loveworks has the ability to transform and empower thousands of young people in North America, and in turn help break the cycle of poverty, bring hope to thousands globally while showing them the love of Jesus in practical ways. I believe that we live in exciting times where God is raising up a generation of passionate followers of Jesus who are responding to His call to put our faith into action by loving the least of these. It is truly humbling to see how God is allowing me to use both my passions and strengths to serve him by being a part of this.

In order to continue doing this however, I need YOUR support. The biggest hurdle I am presently facing is raising the financial support I need to be able to continue working alongside this organization. Presently Loveworks has an incredible promise—we promise to give 100% of all money raised by young people to projects on the ground of their

choice. In order to do this however, each staff member at Loveworks must raise their full salary. 

I (Staci) met a young man about a month ago that's Brazilian, but has just returned from living all over Europe since 2007. We have developed a relationship and invited him over for afternoon coffee. He knows that we are Christians and missionaries and we gifted him with a copy of "The Value of a Dream" and "Coram Deo" (Staci's CD). The next day he accessed Facebook and sent me the following message.

"Hey Neigh, I watched the movie. Smile. It's really cool, u know... Even for people like me, I mean, people that don't get involved with religious issues. I can say that movie is totally "watchable"... ego, envy, success, and family arguing are always present around. Hipocrisy too. Smile. It surprised me. I thought I'd see something like "completely religious". But I faced a movie much more "behaviorist" (does this word exist? hehe) than religious. Really cool. Honestly."

This is just one of the various testimonies about the impact that "The Value of a Dream" is making on people – how it's influencing society and changing the Brazilian 'un-churched' people's view of Christians and their work in the areas of art, film and media.

We are so pleased to announce that "The Value of a Dream" is being distributed like hot cakes and we have officially started the ministry, "Ponte Filmes" (Bridges Films). Daniel was in Sao Paulo at the beginning of October where he participated in the "Christian Exhibition", one of the largest Christian fairs worldwide. He had the opportunity to visit and share at a few churches and distributed about 1000 copies of the film and institutional folder. He will be traveling to distribute the film/folder and share about "Ponte Filmes" every weekend now until we travel to Canada at the end of the year.
