We also have a review of our upcoming Vacation Bible School "SONWEST ROUNDUP" with the theme of the Wild West on August 19 - 23 in the Church Hall at St. Marks. Our VBS has become extremely popular over the past few summers, with last years VBS being the biggest to date with 81 children registered, 8 youth leaders and 20 adult leaders. Registration is limited by the size of the hall and last year we had to turn children away, so for 2013 families are encouraged to register early.

Now that Spring appears to have arrived with the cherry trees in full blossom and the tulips in our church garden showing their colour, let us continue to remember those in our own community who may not have shelter, food or clothing over the summer. ### St. Mark's Community Outreach Ministry

Mission Statement: "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me. And the Lord said, "Whatever you do for the least of these my people, you do for me." Matthew 25: 35-40.

### The History of this Ministry

In 1992, a Ministry was founded by the late Pat Louis of St. Mark's Ocean Park. This Ministry started making sandwiches in the church kitchen and delivered them to the Front Room homeless shelter in Whalley.

Pat Louis's son is schizophrenic and at one time he became lost. Pat and her friends searched for him and finally found him at the 'Front Room' in Whalley. Pat subsequently spoke to St. Mark's congregation after this experience, and told us of the number of people who were living homeless and hungry on the streets.

Pat then initiated St. Mark's parishioners into action with the \$10.00-a-month club delivering food, toiletries, and clothing to those living on the street who came into the "Front Room" in Whalley. Thus the Ministry called the "Front Room Community Outreach Ministry" was born.

At that time, some of the funding donated for the building of our new kitchen at St. Mark's was provided so that we could also prepare food for people at the Front Room, Pat Louis donated funds to the new kitchen to ensure that St. Mark's would be able to continue this worthy work. From this initial program, St. Mark's has moved forward to now having several programs which deliver food, fresh produce or funding and resources to various groups in our community.

In September 2009, the Front Room Community Outreach

Ministry presented the Parish with a report of their ongoing activities. From the initial time of supporting the Front Room through the subsequent 17 years, the Ministry has been initiating more and more projects right here in the South Surrey area outside of the Front Room.

In order to easily identify the Ministry and not limit the area in which these projects are delivered -- a more identifiable Ministry name was needed. The Steering Committee decided that the new name of **St. Mark's Community Outreach Ministry** best suited and encompassed all of the projects.

As we are guided, St. Mark's Community Outreach Ministry continues to grow with ever direction. We are changing blessed and truly grateful for the ongoing support from the Parish of St. Mark's. ### Senior Women in Crisis - AMA House



#### COURSE DESCRIPTION



SESSION 1: ULTIMATE PLAN is revealed!
