PWRDF News

- PWRDF has announced a new joint program with the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA). PWRDF will contribute \$2.7 million over five years towards the \$10.8 million project that will focus on maternal and child health in 59 villages in Burundi, Mozambique, and Tanzania.
- In Cuba, PWRDF is working with the Cuban Council of Churches (CCC) and the Christian Centre for Reflection and Dialogue (CCRD) to raise food production, reduce rural poverty, improve nutrition, improve resilience to climate change, foster gender empowerment and break dependency on imported food.
