PWRDF Update - January and February are busy months for PWRDF's Executive Director and Development Team staff. Adele Finney traveled to a Heads of Agencies meeting in Accra, Ghana and to Masasi, Tanzania to visit projects with PWRDF partners. Librock is traveling from January 17 to March 2 to Tanzania, South Africa, Mozambique, Rwanda and on to Berlin for an Oikocredit, meeting while Zaida Bastos will be in South Africa, Mozambique and Rwanda from January 30 until February 23. Bart Dickinson is traveling from February 5 to the 28 to Mozambique, Rwanda and Tanzania. Zaida, Richard and Bart will be visiting partners, monitoring and evaluating programs and setting up PWRDF's new joint program with Global Affairs Canada (GAC). PWRDF will contribute \$2,654,612 over five years towards the \$17,697,412 project that will focus on maternal and child health in 350 villages in Burundi, Mozambique, Rwanda and Tanzania.
