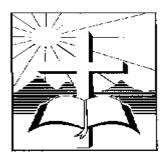


## Library News

If you live with a chronic condition such as arthritis, high blood pressure, diabetes, asthma, or deal with stress & resultant anxiety in your life, this program will help you to make useful changes to your lifestyle. We will meet in the Education Center for 2 hours, once a week, for 6 weeks in this free course. We will learn to manage and understand our symptoms, set goals & learn problem solving techniques - & to communicate more effectively with our health care team. The course is led by trained facilitators who have a variety of chronic conditions themselves.
