
The Men's Club is once again collecting <u>unused</u> <u>Christmas Cards</u> to give the Surrey Remand Center. A box for donations is in the Narthex.

TO VOTE AT VESTRY - Voting members of Vestry shall consist of all baptized persons of the age of fifteen or over who are accustomed worshippers within the Parish and whose names have been on the Membership Roll of the Parish for at least the three months preceding the Vestry Meeting (the next Vestry Meeting will be held on February 19, 2017). No person shall have their name on the Membership roll of more than one Parish in this Diocese at the same time.

To apply to be on the St. Mark Ocean Park's membership roll, and be eligible to vote during the next Vestry, new parishioners may submit a Membership Registration form to the Church Office. If you are a new parishioner, and have not already done so, please pick up a Membership Registration form located on the counter in the Narthex (beneath the Brochure Rack), fill it out, and hand it in at the Office by Tues. Nov. 15, 2016.
