Your Community Outreach Ministry wants you to know...... Everyone Needs Fresh Vegetables.

Those people who are accessing the Food Bank, or women dropping into 'Sources Women's Place' for lunch need fresh vegetables.

In consultation with these two organizations, your community Outreach Ministry donates \$100 quarterly towards the purchase of fresh vegetables. Either at the Food Bank, or to use when serving lunches at Women's Place. The Women's Place serves lunch to approximately 40 women several days of the week.

The local Food Bank's goal is to provide enough food for each person for at least 2 days per week. Additional seasonal provisions include fresh garden produce in the summer and school supplies in the fall.

The White Rock/South Surrey Food Bank provides weekly support services to over 600 people living in the White Rock and South Surrey area.

<u>Canadian Government announces matching</u> <u>fund for Famine Relief</u>

On May 29, the federal government announced it will match funds donated to Canadian NGOs for famine relief in Africa and the Middle East until June 30, 2017. This means for every \$1 donated to PWRDF's Famine Relief appeal, the government will put \$1 into its Famine Relief Fund (for the government to allocate). The 1:1 match will be applied retroactively to all funds donated for emergency response since March 17, 2017. More than \$140,000 has been donated since our appeal was announced in March of this year, and we are grateful for continued funding from individuals and churches across Canada. The countries identified by the government for matching funding are the most desperate: Nigeria, Somalia, South Sudan and Yemen. A group of neighbouring countries at risk of starvation conditions has also been identified: Cameroon, Chad, Niger, Kenya, Ethiopia and Uganda. "Famine, hunger and preventable disease in these countries require our urgent response," says Will Postma, Executive Director of PWRDF. "Through this match opportunity Canadians can know that our response will go further to respond to the urgencies for nutritious food, clean water, health care and other humanitarian needs."
