Thanks to funds from PWRDF through the Cuban Council of Churches, the community was able to purchase "Abriendo Caminos," a Russian-made tractor whose name aptly means "opening trails". The community has made different carts to hitch to the tractor for a variety of purposes, such as ferrying children to school and sick patients to the hospital, helping the community far more than was ever imagined.
