RE: Reintroducing the Holy Cup at Eucharist, Communion Rails, and future revisions for our Order of Service bulletins

Grace and peace to you in our Lord Jesus Christ,

This Sunday, June 5, is Pentecost Sunday and we will be instituting again the Holy Cup at Eucharist along with the use of communion rails. There have been some questions regarding how to receive the Blood of Christ. The Rt. Rev. John Stephens issued a pastoral letter regarding intinction (dipping the body of Christ wafer into the Blood of Christ, wine), which is not our practice in the Diocese of New Westminster and I agree wholeheartedly. The reasons are many but it is not hygienically safe to do this and it contaminates the wine with bread elements, which would exclude those who have gluten sensitivities from receiving the cup. Therefore, we will follow the pastoral sensibilities of our chief pastor on this subject to reduce hygiene issues. Secondly, if you are uncomfortable receiving the cup when it is brought to you by the communion minister, you simply touch the base of the chalice as a sign of reverence.

Additionally, in the days to come we will have our prayer books put back into the pews. One of the things I have noticed, particularly at the 10am service, is that our order of service is unacceptably large. We need to reduce our environmental footprint as well as the cost of copying so many pages in the bulletin. We will reintroduce and start using our prayer books in the weeks to come with a more condensed order of service bulletin as a result.

Pathways to Reconciliation #4 Invitation

Dear St. Mark Ocean Park Parishioners,

Co-sponsored by Church of the Holy Trinity and St. Mark Ocean Park we have completed three of four study groups in the series 'Pathways to Reconciliation'. The program is designed to explore the history of First Nations, Metis and Inuit and their relationship with Canada. Last October we discussed the Anglican Church of Canada's video: "The Doctrine of Discovery – Stolen Lands, Strong Hearts". In March, we listened to Lynda Gray discuss her book "First Nations 101: lots of stuff you need to know about First Nations people". On April 2nd, we reviewed "The Indian Act and Residential Schools." Our **fourth gathering** will be on:

Saturday June 18th, at St. Mark Ocean Park from 1:30-4:30pm This event is free of charge.


The theme on Sat. June 18 is "Resilience and how we can move forward." The Truth and Reconciliation Commission's report of 2015 listed 94 Calls to Action. We will learn (i) how many of these recommendations have been completed, (ii) how many are in process, and (iii) how many have not begun. We will also focus on the Calls to Action #58 - #61 that specifically invite churches and religious organizations to participate in the process of healing. How has the Anglican Church, both nationally and locally, faced these challenges?

The Parish Creation Care Ministry

"Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain, and renew the life of the Earth?"

In 2013 after 3 years of discussion at General Synod; this vow was added to the Baptismal Rite in the Book of Alternative Services. The wording was adopted from one of the 5 Marks of Mission in the Worldwide Anglican Church.

In May 2015 a motion was passed by St. Mark's Parish Council to transform the role of "Environmental Steward" on Council to establish a *Creation Care Ministry*. The goals of this Ministry would be to encourage all parishioners to live out their Baptismal vow.

Our aims would be:

- 1) to reduce as much as possible anything going into the landfill
- to optimally manage the 3+ acre site of The parish of St. Mark including its many gardens, forest, and structures
- 3) to reduce the cost and improve the efficiency of light, heat, water
 - & paper used in the complex of the church proper, the Education Centre, Parish Hall & Office
- 4) to engage the members of the parish and of the local community in environmentally friendly education and activities.

Under the "Environmental Stewards" 2 compost bins were begun on site to reduce wet waste at a time when the City had not yet developed its recycling initiatives. A bicycle rack was installed to encourage an alternate mode of transport, and B.C. Hydro did an energy audit of the building. Much has **evolved** in this Ministry since 2015 so watch for more to come.

Check out the Creation Care display on the South Wall of the Parish Hall after each service and watch for donated garden produce, seedlings, flowers, etc. as the growing season progresses. Matching donations up to \$500,000.00 will equip the worldwide vaccine programmes long operated by UNICEF to distribute COVID 19 vaccines in poorer countries,
