Prayer Corner August 27, 2023

The theme from last week continues: God has a good plan. God can bring good out of troubled times. Christ - the Messiah - the unique Son of God makes all the difference. Praise Father, Son and Holy Spirit: Our Creator, Refuge, Redeemer, Guide!

Suggested Prayer - One - Hide It In Your Mind and Heart

All shall be well, and all shall be well and all manner of thing shall be well.

– Julian of Norwich

If God hadn't been for us
If the Lord had not been with us
We would have lost our lives.

Our help is in the name of the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth.

- Based on Psalm 124 (NIV, The Message)

Since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. - Hebrews 12:1-2 (NIV)

Consider memorizing one or more of these holy phrases to have ready to repeat to yourself or share with others when encouragement and courage is needed.

Suggested Prayer - Two - Lament and Listen

This Sunday we read the story of Moses' birth and rescue from the destructive plans of Pharaoh. His name means "Pulled Out" (The Message) or "Drew Out" (NIV). He was pulled out of the river into the safety of Pharaoh's daughter's arms. He would grow to lead his people, Israel, as God "drew them out" of slavery in Egypt.

What do you want to be "pulled out" of? What do you want a loved one to be "drawn out" of? What do you want our community, our country, our world "pulled/drawn out" of? Spend time being honest with God about your sorrows and fears - your hopes and dreams.

Spend time in quiet stillness listening for what God may have to tell you. Consider journaling your experience of this prayer time.

Suggested Prayer - Three - A Morning Prayer based on St. Patrick's prayer:

I arise today through a mighty strength, the invocation of the Trinity, belief in the Threeness, confession of the Oneness of the Creator of creation.

I arise today through
God's strength to pilot me,
God's might to uphold me,
God's wisdom to guide me,
God's eye to look before me,
God's ear to hear me,
God's word to speak for me,
God's hand to guard me,
God's shield to protect me,
God's host to save me

I arise today through the strength of Christ Christ be with me,
Christ beside me, on my right and on my left,
Christ behind me and before me,
Christ above me and beneath me,
Christ when I lie down,
Christ when I sit down,
Christ within me,
Christ to win me,
Christ to comfort and restore.

Consider saying this prayer at the start of each day this week.
