Steadfast in Hope

As I write these prayers I am mindful that on Saturday we will observe Remembrance Day. I am anticipating that, for me, it will be a particularly sorrowful one. Yet, I have hope that as people gather to reflect and pray good will be seeded; possibly we will have good news to give thanks for on that day.

It is difficult to live with a divided heart: part lamenting over what I witness unfolding in our world and part rejoicing with gratitude in the beauty, grace, and love of God and the life I have through Jesus Christ. I wonder if any of this resonates with your spirit.

As I have pondered how to stay steadfast in hope, The Holy Spirit has encouraged me to practice a version of the "Breath Prayer" that Rev. David has been using when opening our Sunday services this week. It is my intention to engage this practice when I awaken for the day, at midday, at the close of my day and whenever I find myself becoming

stressed or despondent. I invite you to join me. Let The Holy Spirit lead you to the times that what would best nurture HOPE in your soul.

Breath Prayer

Remembering that God is Love (1 John 4:8) and the source of life, take a deep breath. Breathe in love.

Remembering that Jesus conquered death and lives to intercede for us (Hebrews 7:25), exhale.

Breathe out your sorrow and your fear.

Repeat 3 to 5 times in succession.

Consider modifying your inhale to breathe in the vision of life after the second coming (Rev 21).

Consider modifying your exhale to breathe into God's hands those who are hurting or suffering.

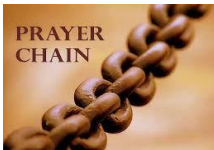
