++++++ PRAYER CORNER - November 26, 2023+++++

The Feast of Christ The King | The Last Sunday of the Year

I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe."

Ephesians 1:17-19

Today we celebrate that Christ is Lord of All. His reign will never end. His full and complete reign is still to come. What a wellspring of hope! Today is also the final Sunday in the church year. Next Sunday we will begin a new year by lighting the first Advent candle: the candle of HOPE. So - we end in hope and begin in hope. At least that is what our tradition says. But how is your personal hope level?

Is hope what you felt as you heard Jesus' words about the sheep and the goats in our Gospel reading today? (Matthew 25:31-46) If so, name that hope and pray with thanksgiving.

If you – like me – find this parable extremely unsettling, I invite you into my musings. This parable has, for most of my life, haunted me. Being honest with myself I know there are times I have behaved like a sheep; other times I have behaved like a goat. The contrast between eternal punishment and eternal life could not be greater and so, the

thought that I (and/or my loved ones) may be counted among the goats rather than the sheep terrifies me. How do I make sense of this? What will Jesus do with us?

- ▶ Putting this parable in the context of Jesus' life of healing ministry I wonder if Jesus plans to heal each of us so that we become fully sheep. That is a hopeful thought. It reduces my fear. Am I kidding myself or am I seeing truth? These words of Scripture come to mind: "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom" (Proverbs 9:10); "perfect love drives out fear" (1 John 4:18); "Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love" (1 John 4:8) and finally Jesus' words to the paralytic, "Do you want to be made well?" (John 5:6). My soul responds, "Yes, Lord" & "Please plant this desire in all."
- Pondering this parable along with all Jesus says in Matthew 24-25 and what Paul wrote to the Thessalonians in 1 Thess. 5, I wonder if God is both exhorting us to wake up & get busy building His kingdom AND promising us that judgement day will mean the end of the human battle with sin. There is Challenge in the exhortation and Hope in the vision of what life will be like without sin. These seem to me, good companions for "New Years Eve".

Suggested Prayer Practice: The EXAMEN.

Take time this week to review your actions over the past year by prayerfully asking The Holy Spirit to bring to your mind specific answers to these questions:

- Where/When did I behave like the sheep in Matthew 25? How do I feel remembering this?
- Where/When did I behave like a goat in Matthew 25, ignoring the call or nudge of The Holy Spirit to act in response to a need that I was able/gifted to meet? How do I feel remembering this?
- Thinking back on these experiences, can I now see Jesus in me? In others?
- Do I notice any barriers to my seeing Jesus?
- How do I rightly understand the relationship between my identity and my behaviour?
- Is there a pattern of thought and/or action that I desire to change with God's help?
- Is Jesus inviting me to something new?

Talk honestly with God about what you have been shown: your feelings, questions, desires and hopes.

Suggested Prayer Practice: Contemplate and Memorize Scripture

We have covered much ground in our series on hope. You may have found that certain verses of Scripture continue to hold a strong attraction or aversion for you. Consider those to be places of holy ground. Sit with the words in the presence of God and listen for his voice.
