+++++++++ PRAYER CORNER - November 5 ++++++++

What follows is an Invitation. It is made with trust that The Holy Spirit will guide you to the prayer practice(s) that will nourish you in mind, body and soul.

Steadfast in Hope

The truth for me is that sometimes it is hard to hold onto hope. When I am feeling that way it is good for me to spend time in Scripture, in holy song, and in the company of Jesus. I invite you to spend time with what sewed hope in my heart as I contemplated the readings of this Sunday. I also encourage you to intentionally carve out time to soak in other verses of scripture or other songs that The Holy Spirit will bring to you as you look for Jesus in your daily life.

In that vein, I share with you what I believe to be a holy encounter from my recent days. Last Saturday I attended a summit at our Diocesan Synod offices. We began in the outdoor courtyard with a time of prayer. One particular line of prayer has stayed with me: "to be truly wise is to understand that knowing and not knowing are one. Each has the power to transform." (Richard Wagamese as quoted by the prayer leader). It has encouraged me, and I pray it encourages you, to welcome both our knowing and our not knowing. Let them be gateways to transforming encounters with God through Jesus.

Grounding Scripture -

And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." (Revelation 21:5)

It will be said on that day -

Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us. This is the Lord for whom we have waited; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation. (Isaiah 25:6)

As you read these verses, does hope rise in you? Do you have questions? Take whatever thoughts, emotions and bodily sensations you have to Jesus in prayer.

Consider memorizing the verse that gives you the most peace, encouragement and hope.

Inspiring Song -

Sit quietly. Breathe deeply. As you listen to this song, what emotions rise in you? Is there a specific person or circumstance that gives you concern? Offer these to Jesus in prayer. Your prayer can be worded or not. Remember, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. (Romans 8:26)

Time with The Son – Prayer of Imagination

God has gifted us with imagination, Scripture, and The Holy Spirit. Guided by The Spirit we can use our imagination to put ourselves into a gospel story. This can be a way for us to encounter Jesus more intimately and to develop our personal relationship with him. I invite you to engage in Prayer of Imagination with this week's Gospel Story, set in its full context **John 11:1-45**

Method:

- Set aside 15-30 minutes to be in a quiet place of solitude.
- Begin with some deep breathing and a prayer such as "Dear God, I offer this time to you. I thank you for the Gospel and ask that The Holy Spirit guide my heart, mind and body as I step into this Gospel story. Enlighten me, teach me, heal me that I may know you and love you and serve you better. Amen"
- Read the passage slowly three or four times. Let the gospel scene ignite your imagination.
- Use your five senses to help you enter the story. Feel free to interact with the people in the story.

- Don't worry about getting distracted. When you notice your mind wandering, gently bring yourself back to the story.
- Focus on what most draws your attention and feel free to let your encounter unfold
- End your time in the Gospel story with a prayer of thanksgiving or The Lord's Prayer
- Consider writing down what struck you as significant.

Guiding Questions:

- What is it like to be in that place and time?
- What do you hear, smell, taste, touch, intuit?
- Which part of the story draws your attention the most?
- Where are you / Who are you in the scene?
- What feelings and bodily sensations emerge as you read and engage with the story?
- Do you have questions for Jesus? For the other people in the story?
- Is there anything you want from Jesus?
- Is there anything you hear Jesus saying to you?
