# Family Prayers for Advent, Christmas & the Epiphany

Advent, Christmas and the Epiphany are three of the most dramatic seasons in the Christian calendar. Some of the most recognisable stories about Jesus take place at this time.

This booklet is meant to be used at home around the **ADVENT WREATH**. Advent wreaths are special prayer centres used at this time of year. To find out more about their history you can go to wikipedia.org and type in 'Advent Wreath'.

It is good to **PRAY TOGETHER** as a family and with friends. These prayers follow a simple 'repeat-after-me' method.

**REPETITION** is a good way to internalise the stories of Jesus. The Scripture readings are meant to be read aloud three times. This follows loosely the practice of *lectio divina* which is a practice that encourages a prayerful reading of the Bible. (For more information on this practice type 'lectio divina' in Wikipedia.) After each reading have a few moments of silence or reflection on what the words mean for you at that moment.

The reading is to be read three times.


A reading from Isaiah (9:2).

The reading is to be read three times.


A reading from Matthew (5:7. 9).
